Operating ATV's, Motorbikes and Quads - within the Village Limits, You must abide by both the Provincial Traffic Safety Act and the Village Bylaws. HELMETS are mandatory to drive these vehicles. As per Clavet Traffic Bylaw No. 2013-01. These Vehicles-are prohibited within the Public Reserve land – Community Hall – Bentley Park - Taylor Park – Ball Diamonds - Dog Park – Land around the Rink and Retention Pond.

Drive your vehicles the most direct route from your home out of Village limits. Do not drive these items around the Village. You cannot drive them up/down alleys – you must leave the village limits to use.

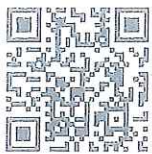
